### REDISTRICTING

#### ***What is redistricting?***

Every ten years, districts must be redrawn so that each district is substantially equal in population. This process, called redistricting, is important in ensuring that each City Council Member represents about the same number of constituents.

#### ***Why does redistricting matter to me?***

Redistricting determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a district for purposes of electing a Council Member. The City Council will seek input in selecting the next district map for our City Council. You have an opportunity to share with the City Council how you think district boundaries should be drawn to best represent your community.

#### ***How will our City Council notify the public about redistricting?***

The City Council will notify the public about redistricting hearings, post maps online before adoption, and create a dedicated webpage (<https://www.cityofhighland.org/331/Redistricting-Redistrictin>) for all relevant information about the redistricting process.

#### ***How can I get involved?***

The City Council will be holding hearings to receive public input on where district lines should be drawn. Please visit our Redistricting webpage for information and public hearing dates. You can also submit public comments, including suggested draft maps, by emailing [districts@cityofhighland.org](mailto:districts@cityofhighland.org).

The third Public Hearing will be held on January 11, 2022, at 6:00 p.m., at which the City Council will:

1. Receive a report from National Demographics Corporation (NDC), Consultant, on the redistricting process and permissible criteria to be considered to redraw district boundaries;
2. Review draft map(s); and
3. Receive public input on district boundaries.

The public hearing will be held in the City Hall Donahue Council Chambers, 27215 Base Line, Highland, California, 92346. All staff reports and supporting documentation will be available for review in the office of the City Clerk at 27215 Base Line, Highland, CA 92346, and on the City's website at <https://www.cityofhighland.org/331/Redistricting-Redistrictin> on and after January 6, 2022. Please contact the City Clerk's office at 909.864.6861, ext. 226, if live translation in an applicable language, Spanish, as determined by the Secretary of State, is needed for this hearing. Notification 72 hours prior to the meeting will enable the City to make reasonable arrangements.

For those wishing to make public comments at the January 11, 2022 City Council meeting, please submit your comments via email to be read aloud at the meeting. Comments can be submitted any time prior to the meeting as well as during the meeting up until the end of the corresponding item. Please submit your comments to the City Clerk at [publiccomment@cityofhighland.org](mailto:publiccomment@cityofhighland.org) or [districts@cityofhighland.org](mailto:districts@cityofhighland.org). All email comments shall be subject to the same rules as would otherwise govern speaker comments at the City Council meeting. Members of the public will be permitted to make public comments in person.

## **Redistribución**

### ***¿Qué es la redistribución?***

Cada diez años, los distritos deben rediseñarse para que cada distrito sea sustancialmente igual en población. Este proceso, llamado redistribución, es importante para garantizar que cada miembro del Concejo Municipal represente aproximadamente el mismo número de constituyentes.

### ***¿Por qué me importa la redistribución?***

La redistribución de distritos determina qué vecindarios y comunidades se agrupan en un distrito con el fin de elegir a un miembro del Consejo. El Concejo Municipal buscará aportes en la selección del próximo mapa distrital para nuestro Concejo Municipal. Usted tiene la oportunidad de compartir con el Concejo Municipal cómo cree que se deben trazar los límites del distrito para representar mejor a su comunidad.

### ***¿Cómo notificará nuestro Ayuntamiento al público sobre la redistribución de distritos?***

El Concejo Municipal notificará al público sobre las audiencias de redistribución, publicará mapas en línea antes de la adopción y creará una página web dedicada (<https://www.cityofhighland.org/331/Redistricting-Redistribucion>) para toda la información relevante sobre el proceso de redistribución de distritos.

### ***¿Cómo puedo participar?***

El Concejo Municipal llevará a cabo audiencias para recibir aportes públicos sobre dónde se deben trazar las líneas del distrito. The City of Highland is encouraging small businesses in Highland to apply for the Coronavirus Recovery Fund grant program, first launched in September. ## What You Should Know About Street Sweeping in Highland

1) Help us to serve you better by removing all possible obstacles from the street on your scheduled day. Although the City of Highland does not enforce street sweeping parking restrictions, we appreciate your assistance in keeping the streets clear on your scheduled day.

Parked vehicles cause the operator to swing wide to miss them. Moving vehicles off a street scheduled for sweeping allows crews to thoroughly clean the street from curb-to-curb. One parked car equals nearly three car lengths of space that can't be swept because the street sweeping equipment must leave room to avoid it. This can result in debris building up on the roadway and entering the storm drain which can cause flooding during heavy rains and contribute to water pollution.

2) In residential areas the street sweeper can sweep **anytime** from 7am to 5pm, the day after your solid waste collection day.

3) If solid waste collection is delayed one day due to a holiday, the street sweeper will be delayed one day as well. There is **NO** holiday delay this year.



4) Since sweeping is done as close to the curb as possible, things like overhanging tree branches, basketball hoops, solid waste collection carts and especially parked vehicles cause the operator to swing wide to miss them. When this happens, debris is left on the street and the quality of the sweeping is reduced.

5) Street sweeping also serves as one of our Best Management Practices (BMP) to control and improve water quality.

- The City of Highland reserves the right to end the event at any time due to product availability.



Compost can be used as a soil additive in gardens and flower beds to give plants additional nutrients and acts as a natural fertilizer. Compost helps grow stronger, healthier flowers, plants and vegetables.

## Tips on How to Protect Yourself from Winter Weather



### **Winter Storm Warning**

If you should find yourself under a winter storm warning, find shelter right away. Winter storm warnings are issued when hazardous winter weather in the form of heavy snow, heavy freezing rain, or heavy sleet is imminent or occurring. Winter Storm Warnings are usually issued 12 to 24 hours before the event is expected to begin.

### **Winter Storm Watch**

Alerts the public to the possibility of a blizzard, heavy snow, heavy freezing rain, or heavy sleet. Winter Storm Watches are usually issued 12 to 48 hours before the beginning of a Winter Storm.

### **Winter Weather Advisory**

Issued for accumulations of snow, freezing rain, freezing drizzle, and sleet which will cause significant inconveniences and, if caution is not exercised, could lead to life-threatening situations.

### **Know Your Risk for Winter Storms**

Pay attention to weather reports and warnings of freezing weather and winter storms. Listen for emergency information and alerts. Sign up for your community's warning system. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and [National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration \(NOAA\) Weather Radio](#) also provide emergency alerts.

### **Preparing for Winter Weather**

Prepare your home to keep out the cold with insulation, caulking and weather stripping. Learn how to keep pipes from freezing. Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups. Gather supplies in case you need to stay home for several days without power. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including medication. Remember the needs of your pets. Have extra batteries for radios and flashlights. If you are unable to afford your heating costs, weatherization, or energy-related home repairs, contact the [Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program \(LIHEAP\)](#) for help.

### **In Case of Emergency**

Be prepared for winter weather at home, at work and in your car. Create an emergency supply kit for your car. Include jumper cables, sand, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water and non-perishable snacks. Keep a full tank of gas.

# How to Safely Dispose Sharps

**EFFECTIVE  
JULY 1, 2021**



SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY RESIDENTS can safely dispose of their used SHARPS in a 2 gallon or smaller, heavy-duty, plastic container as an alternative to plastic bio-hazard sharps containers at participating Household Hazardous Waste Collection facilities.

Containers should only contain needles, lancets, and syringes with a needle attached that must be completely spent (no liquid remaining, including EpiPens).

## HOW TO CREATE YOUR OWN CONTAINER:

- Place sharps into an Approved Sharps Container or 2 gallon or smaller heavy-duty plastic container
- Do not use food product containers
- Must have a screw-top and puncture resistant lid
- Made of thick plastic
- 2 gallons or less
- Leak-resistant
- Remain upright when standing
- Place printed Bio-Hazard Label on both sides
- When  $\frac{3}{4}$  filled, secure lid, and tape the container closed

# Cómo desechar las agujas de forma segura

**EFFECTIVO EL  
1 DE JULIO 2021**



LOS RESIDENTES DEL CONDADO DE SAN BERNARDINO pueden desechar de manera segura sus agujas usadas en un recipiente de plástico resistente de 2 galones, o más pequeño como alternativa a los recipientes de plástico para objetos punzantes con riesgo biológico en los Centros participantes de Colección para desechos peligrosos del hogar.

Los recipientes solo deben contener agujas, lancetas y jeringas con una aguja adjunta que debe gastarse por completo (Sin residuo líquido incluyendo los EpiPens).

## COMO CREAR SU PROPIO CONTENEDOR:

- Coloque las agujas en un recipiente para objetos punzantes aprobado o en un recipiente de plástico resistente de 2 galones o más pequeño
- No utilice envases de productos para alimentos
- Debe tener una tapa de rosca y resistente a los pinchazos
- Hecho de plástico grueso
- 2 galones o menos
- Resistente a fugas
- Permanezca erguido cuando esté de pie
- Coloque la etiqueta impresa de peligro biológico en ambos lados
- Cuando esté lleno 3/4, cierre la tapa y pegue el recipiente con cinta adhesiva para mantener el contenedor cerrado
