**Funding Currently Available!!!**

The City of Highland is encouraging small businesses in Highland to apply for the Coronavirus Recovery Fund grant program. First launched in September, the purpose of this program is to provide financial assistance to City-based small businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Successful grant recipients will receive a one-time \$7,500 disbursement.

Businesses that meet these specific criteria are eligible for consideration:

- Must have a physical location within the City of Highland (store front, office, commercial structure).
- Be in good standing with the City of Highland (**current/valid business license, no outstanding code enforcement actions, or compliance orders**).
- Must have no more than 100 employees.
- Must be in existence as of August 24, 2021.

## SOUND THE ALARM SIGN UP FOR FREE SMOKE ALARM INSTALLATION!

The American Red Cross has started a new program. Under normal circumstances, the Red Cross partners up with volunteers to canvas neighborhoods to install free smoke alarms in homes, replace batteries in existing alarms and help families create home fire escape plans. Unfortunately, COVID has prevented them from hosting rally events of this type. The modified program is now an appointment based, "hot shot" program. This program will consist of installing FREE smoke alarms and providing home fire safety education to residents by appointment only.

The installation service and the home fire preparedness education are FREE to the resident. After signing up, a Red Cross volunteer will contact the resident to schedule the appointment. Volunteers will be following all COVID-19 precautions before entering the home and while in the home.






# RE-PETE WANTS YOU TO KNOW...

## *What is Stormwater Pollution?*

Stormwater is urban runoff water that has picked up pollutants as it flows through the storm drain system—a network of channels, gutters and pipes that collect runoff from city streets, neighborhoods, farms, construction sites and parking lots—and empties directly into local waterways. Unlike sewage, which goes to treatment plants to remove toxins, urban runoff flows untreated through the storm drain system and directly into our local water bodies.

Anything thrown, swept or poured into the street, gutter or a catch basin—the curbside openings that lead into the storm drain system—can flow into our channels, rivers and eventually to the ocean. This includes a list of pollutants like:

- Trash
- Pet Waste
- Cigarette Butts
- Motor Oil
- Anti Freeze



Unlike sewage, which goes to treatment plants to remove toxins, urban runoff flows untreated through the storm drain system and directly into our local water bodies.

# Pool Discharge Tips

Maintain your pool properly and help protect the environment

## DID YOU KNOW?

Routine swimming pool maintenance generates a variety of wastes such as cleaning wastewater, filter back-wash residues, biocides and acid washes that can contribute to stormwater pollution. Chlorine and other pool chemicals can harm our waterways when they are discharged improperly.



Share these good housekeeping practices with your pool service personnel to keep pollutants out of our waterways:

## HOLD IT BEFORE YOU DRAIN IT.

- De-chlorinate the water before draining the pool to the storm drain.
- Consult with your pool contractor before de-chlorinating the pool to learn about your options.

### SHUT:

Shut off the chlorination system or stop adding chlorine.

### HOLD:

Hold the water in the pool for at least 5 days or add a de-chlorinating agent.

### TEST:

Use a pool testing kit to ensure the level of chlorine is at 0.1ppm before discharging the water.

- Make sure all debris is removed and chemicals are dissipated.
- pH of pool water should be between 6.5 and 8.5 before discharging.
- Make sure the water is free of any discoloration, mosquitoes, dirt or algae.

## IMPORTANT:

- Dispose of filter backwash solids in the trash or landscape area.
- Neutralize acid washes before discharging to the sewer. Do not discharge to the storm drain.

### DRAIN:

Check with your city for local requirements before discharging your pool to the storm drain or sewer.

- **Alternative 1: Sanitary Sewer** — Some cities allow pools to be drained to the sanitary sewer during non-peak hours.
- **Alternative 2: Lawn or Garden** — Discharge the pool water through the lawn or garden. The flow should be controlled to prevent erosion problems or the water entering a neighbor's property.
- **For Saltwater Pools:** Saltwater pools should only be drained to the sewer or hauled away.

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# WASH YOUR CAR THE ECO-FRIENDLY WAY!

When possible, wash in a professional car wash.

- 1 **Locate** the nearest storm drain and ensure that wash water does not flow into it.



- 2 **Wash** in a contained area or on grass\*, gravel or other permeable surface. Dispose of excess soapy water into the sanitary sewer (*ie. sink or toilet*) or onto grass.

- 3 **Use** eco-friendly cleaning products (*non-toxic, phosphate free or biodegradable*). Use as little soap as possible and wipe brake dust off tires with a rag before washing.

- 4 **Conserve** water by using a high pressure hose and turn off the water when not in use.

\*Some local ordinances may not allow a car to be parked on the front lawn. Check with your City's Building and Code department if you are unsure.

## How Does Eco Car Washing Help Local Waterways?

When excess wash water travels through the street it has the potential to pick up oil, grease and other chemicals along the way before it ends up in the curb, gutter and the storm drain system. **This contaminated water then travels to our creeks and the Santa Ana River making it unsafe for people and wildlife.**

-  Dog waste can affect the quality of our rivers and oceans and make the water unsafe for swimming, drinking, or fishing.



## BAG IT AND TRASH IT! — Steps and Tips —

- Step 1:** Keep a supply of bags tied to your dog leash.
- Step 2:** Bag the poop and tie the bag.
- Step 3:** Dispose of the tied bag properly by throwing it into a trash can.



## Sustainable Practices for Landscape Maintenance

Your contributions make a difference in the way you maintain your yard. Learn how to truly be a “green” thumb and prevent stormwater pollution.

### Recycle Yard Waste



Yard waste, like grass and leaves, can block the storm drain or carry harmful chemicals into it.

- Recycle yard waste by placing them into your greenwaste container.
- Do not blow, sweep, rake, or hose yard waste into the street or catch basin.
- Try grasscycling by leaving clippings on the lawn when mowing.

### Use Safe Products



Fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides are often carried into the storm drain by sprinkler runoff.

- Use natural and non-toxic alternatives as often as possible.
- Spot-apply, rather than blanketing entire areas.

Apply chemicals directly to the area that needs treatment.

- Read the product label and use only as directed.
- Never apply before a rain.

### Use Water Wisely



Conserving water minimizes the amount of urban runoff going into the street.

- Control the amount of water and direction of sprinklers.

The average lawn only needs about an inch of water a week or 10 to 20 minutes of watering.

- Periodically inspect and fix sprinklers for leaks.

Realign sprinkler heads to make sure water is distributed onto the lawn and not onto the sidewalk.

- Plant native vegetation to reduce the need of water.



### HOMEOWNERS

Keep these tips in mind when hiring professional landscapers and remind them as necessary.



Leftover pesticides, fertilizers, and herbicides contaminate landfills and should be disposed of through a Household Hazardous Waste Center\*.



## Prácticas Sostenibles para el Mantenimiento de Jardinería

Sus acciones pueden marcar una gran diferencia en la forma en que usted mantenga su jardín. Aprenda cómo implementar prácticas ecológicas y prevenir la contaminación de las aguas pluviales.

### Recicle los Residuos de Jardín



Los desechos de jardín, como la hierba y las hojas, pueden bloquear el drenaje pluvial o transportar productos químicos dañinos.

- Recicle los desechos del jardín colocándolos en su contenedor verde de desechos.
- No sople, barra, rastrille ni riegue los desechos del patio en la calle o en la cuneta.
- Intente reciclar el césped dejando los recortes sobre el césped.

### Use Productos Seguros



Los fertilizantes, herbicidas y pesticidas a menudo son arrastrados al drenaje pluvial a través del agua sobrante proveniente de los rociadores.

- Use alternativas naturales y no tóxicas con la mayor frecuencia posible.
- Aplique los productos en las áreas específicas que requiera tratamiento en lugar de cubrir áreas enteras.
- Lea la etiqueta del producto y use solo como se indica.
- Nunca aplique antes de una lluvia.

### Use el Agua de Forma Inteligente



La conservación del agua minimiza la cantidad de escorrentía que va a la calle a través del agua sobrante.

- Controle la cantidad de agua y la dirección de los rociadores.

El césped promedio solo necesita aproximadamente una pulgada de agua por semana, incluida la lluvia, o 10 a 20 minutos de riego.

- Inspeccione y repare periódicamente los rociadores para detectar fugas y goteos.

Realíe las cabezas de los rociadores para asegurarse de que el agua se distribuya en el césped y no en la acera.

- Plante vegetación autóctona para reducir la necesidad de agua.

Tenga en cuenta estos consejos al contratar jardineros profesionales y haga que los mantengan presente como sea necesario.
