

STREET SWEEPING FACTS

In residential areas the street sweeper can sweep anytime from 6:00am to 6:00pm, the day after your solid waste collection day.

If solid waste collection is delayed one day due to a holiday, the street sweeper will be delayed one day as well.

Since sweeping is done as close to the curb as possible, things like overhanging tree branches, basketball hoops, solid waste collection carts and especially parked vehicles cause the operator to swing wide to miss them. When this happens, debris is left on the street and the quality of the sweeping is reduced.

Help us to serve you better by removing all possible obstacles from the street on your scheduled day. Although the City of Highland does not enforce street sweeping parking restrictions, we appreciate your assistance in keeping the streets clear on your scheduled day.

Street sweeping also serves as one of our Best Management Practices (BMP) to control and improve water quality.





Did you know that your SEWER DRAIN and your STREET STORM drain are different?

Sink and toilet water goes into a sewer drain and flows to a wastewater treatment plant before it's cleaned and released into waterways like rivers, lakes, and the ocean.

THE DIFFERENCE is there's no cleaning of dirty water before it flows into waterways from street (storm) drains. The dirty water and debris, like grass clippings and leaves, can hurt fish, plants, and other aquatic life by polluting the water where they live.

Ideas to Prevent Street (Storm) Drain Pollution:

- Sweep driveways clean instead of using water.
- Minimize the amount of fertilizer you use.
- Eliminate piles of grass, leaves, and other debris in the street.
- Adjust sprinklers to prevent leaking water from flowing into the street.
- Go to a car wash where water is cleaned before it goes into waterways.
- Keep items like oil and chemicals out of gutters and storm drains.
- Use cat litter to clean up oil on driveways and sidewalks.
- Clean up after your pets and dispose of waste in a garbage can or toilet.

HOW TO COLLECT FOOD WASTE AT HOME



1 COLLECT

Begin collecting food waste separate from your other trash and recycling. This includes: fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, bread, dairy, eggshells, coffee, plate scrapings, peels, rinds, food soiled paper, and expired food.

2 ADD & SECURE

Add food waste to its own separate plastic-lined container. Store it in a convenient place, such as on your countertop, in your refrigerator or under your sink. Secure your plastic bag by tying it off. Remember, bags do not have to be compostable or biodegradable. They can be any color. We encourage you to re-use bags you may already have such as bread bags and produce bags.



3 DISCARD

Place your bagged food waste into your green barrel, along with your green waste. Continue using your green waste barrel as usual. Remember, food waste no longer belongs in your trash barrel.

Residential Food Waste Recycling Program - FAQs

Am I required to participate?

Yes. This is a California law that requires all residents, multifamily tenants, and commercial businesses to participate in food waste recycling to comply with Senate Bill 1383.

Will plastic bags be supplied?

Customers will be required to use their own bags. Bags do not need to be compostable or biodegradable.

What is the benefit of recycling food waste?

Your recycling efforts contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from landfilled organic waste. This includes methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more potent than carbon dioxide.

I already backyard compost, do I have to participate?

We encourage you to continue backyard composting. Organic items not suitable for backyard compost can be recycled through this program.

Can I use my garbage disposal instead?

No need to change your current garbage disposal use. Food currently being discarded in your trash barrel should now be bagged and placed in your green waste barrel.

What items are acceptable?

Fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, dairy, eggshells, bread, food scraps, food soiled paper, plate scrapings, and expired food.

What items are not acceptable?

Trash, styrofoam, liquids, glass, plastic, metal, diapers, pet waste, electronic waste, and hazardous waste.

Have you heard about the Highland Improvement Team a.k.a. H.I.T.? Our mission is to improve the overall environment of our city for all residents and businesses in Highland. Top priority is property cleanup projects for disabled and senior citizens. There are no income eligibility requirements and absolutely no charge to the homeowner. A fabulous team of volunteers complete all the work and repair at H.I.T. projects.

H.I.T. is currently accepting requests for residential cleanups. H.I.T. projects are scheduled on Saturday's, once per month and typically occur from 8:00 am to 12 noon. Each project must require enough work to fill the allotted four-hour period. We urge qualifying Highland homeowners who need help with yard cleanup and minor landscaping to contact Volunteer Services as soon as possible. We screen all requests, and schedule projects on a first come, first served basis.

Here are the few qualifications needed:

1. Homeowner must be 55 years and older or disabled, any age.

AND

2. Must own and reside in the home.
