

### Agency Partnerships

East Valley Water District's General Manager Michael Moore, Board of Directors David Smith and Phillip Goodrich attended the City Council Meeting on May 14 to commend the city for their partnership with the water district to complete the Sterling Natural Resource Center Project (SNRC). This new center consists of a Treatment Facility, located on the northeast corner of 5th Street and Del Rosa Drive and an Administration Center located on the northwest corner of the intersection. The SNRC will provide a sustainable new water supply to boost the region's water independence.



## What City Am I In?

Do you live in the City of Highland, City of San Bernardino or within the unincorporated area of San Bernardino County? One of the most frequent questions received at City Hall by residents is related to matching Zip codes and city limits. **The boundaries of a Zip code generally have nothing to do with city limits.** ZIP codes are based on the location of the post office that is delivering your mail, they are set to aid mail delivery. As a result of this structure, cities and towns across the country have quarreled with the Post Office for years over this issue.

As described by the United States Postal Service, "If the postal carrier is driving down a road delivering mail and happens to cross the city limits, it makes little sense to have them stop delivering for the rest of the houses on the street simply because the city limits changed. Instead, they'll keep delivering along the street to the next intersection or some other boundary that makes more sense to allocating their available resources, i.e. delivery personnel."

The fact that Zip code boundaries do not always match city boundaries can cause confusion for residents when they call for services. A customer may be a Highland resident even if they have a San Bernardino mailing address. For example, if they live east of Lankershim Avenue within the City of Highland, they will have a Highland mailing address with a 92346 zip code. The most easterly portion of the city located east of the Santa Ana River has a Mentone mailing address with a 92359 zip code. Similarly, many San Bernardino residents have a Highland mailing address.

If a resident would like confirmation if they live within the city limits of Highland, call or come to City Hall. In addition, you can go on our website's homepage [www.highland.org](http://www.highland.org) and click on our "GIS Map" portal and type in your address to confirm what jurisdiction you are in.



## 5 STEPS FOR SAFE DIGGING

Working on an outdoor project? Careless digging poses a threat to people, pipelines and underground facilities. Always call 8-1-1 first. Here are five easy steps for safe digging:



Know what's below.  
Call before you dig.

### 1. NOTIFY

Call 8-1-1 or make a request online two to three days before your work begins. The operator will notify the utilities affected by your project.

### 2. WAIT

Wait two to three days for affected utilities to respond to your request. They will send a locator to mark any underground utility lines.

### 3. CONFIRM

Confirm that all affected utilities have responded to your request by comparing the marks to the list of utilities the 8-1-1 call center notified.



### 4. RESPECT

Respect the markers provided by the affected utilities. The markers are your guide for the duration of your project.



### 5. DIG CAREFULLY

If you can't avoid digging near the markers (within 18-24 inches on all sides, depending on state laws), consider moving your project location.

## Did you know that your SEWER DRAIN and your STREET STORM drain are different?

Sink and toilet water goes into a sewer drain and flows to a wastewater treatment plant before it's cleaned and released into waterways like rivers, lakes, and the ocean.

THE DIFFERENCE is there's no cleaning of dirty water before it flows into waterways from street (storm) drains. The dirty water and debris, like grass clippings and leaves, can hurt fish, plants, and other aquatic life by polluting the water where they live.

Ideas to Prevent Street (Storm) Drain Pollution:

- Sweep driveways clean instead of using water.
- Minimize the amount of fertilizer you use.
- Eliminate piles of grass, leaves, and other debris in the street.
- Adjust sprinklers to prevent leaking water from flowing into the street.
- Go to a car wash where water is cleaned before it goes into waterways.
- Keep items like oil and chemicals out of gutters and storm drains.
- Use cat litter to clean up oil on driveways and sidewalks.
- Clean up after your pets and dispose of waste in a garbage can or toilet.

# HOW TO COLLECT FOOD WASTE AT HOME



## 1 COLLECT

Begin collecting food waste separate from your other trash and recycling. This includes: fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, bread, dairy, eggshells, coffee, plate scrapings, peels, rinds, food soiled paper, and expired food.

## 2 ADD & SECURE

Add food waste to its own separate plastic-lined container. Store it in a convenient place, such as on your countertop, in your refrigerator or under your sink. Secure your plastic bag by tying it off. Remember, bags do not have to be compostable or biodegradable. They can be any color. We encourage you to re-use bags you may already have such as bread bags and produce bags.



## 3 DISCARD

Place your bagged food waste into your green barrel, along with your green waste. Continue using your green waste barrel as usual. Remember, food waste no longer belongs in your trash barrel.

# Residential Food Waste Recycling Program - FAQs

## Am I required to participate?

Yes. This is a California law that requires all residents, multifamily tenants, and commercial businesses to participate in food waste recycling to comply with Senate Bill 1383.

## Will plastic bags be supplied?

Customers will be required to use their own bags. Bags do not need to be compostable or biodegradable.

## What is the benefit of recycling food waste?

Your recycling efforts contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from landfilled organic waste. This includes methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more potent than carbon dioxide.

## I already backyard compost, do I have to participate?

We encourage you to continue backyard composting. Organic items not suitable for backyard compost can be recycled through this program.

## Can I use my garbage disposal instead?

No need to change your current garbage disposal use. Food currently being discarded in your trash barrel should now be bagged and placed in your green waste barrel.

## What items are acceptable?

Fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, dairy, eggshells, bread, food scraps, food soiled paper, plate scrapings, and expired food.

## What items are not acceptable?

Trash, styrofoam, liquids, glass, plastic, metal, diapers, pet waste, electronic waste, and hazardous waste.






