FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL IN HIGHLAND

The Highland Sheriff's Department and Fire Department wish to remind residents that fireworks are not permitted within the City of Highland city limits. It is a violation to own, use, or sell any type of fireworks within the city. The use of fireworks may result in a citation and fine of \$1,000 or arrest. Violators will be prosecuted - Highland Municipal Code Section 8.58.020.

Extra officers will be working over the July 4th Holiday period. Fireworks will be confiscated, and violators may be cited or arrested. Possession of explosive devices exceeding 50 milligrams is a felony. Individuals may be held liable for damages (and parents may be held liable for damages caused by their children) resulting from the use of fireworks and for costs of a response by Police and Fire.


Fill up your dishwasher before running and allow your dishes to air dry

Report An Issue


Report an issue or submit a non-emergency service request to the City of Highland from the convenience of your mobile phone or computer through our city website:

www.cityofhighland.org

Report issues such as graffiti, downed trees, illegal dumping, potholes, or code enforcement violations. Reports of a sensitive nature may be submitted confidentially. Citizens who notice a non-emergency within any time of the day can take a picture of the issue, add location information, request details, and send it through. This will allow staff to follow-up with residents once your issue has been submitted.

Before submitting your request, ensure the location of the issue is within Highland's city limits by utilizing our GIS Map on the city website. Residents can always call City Hall for any questions (909) 864-6861.

For disposal of large or bulky items, Burrtec provides for residential curbside large or bulky item collections (maximum of 5 items per collection) during a 12-month period at no extra charge. Please call at least 24 hours in advance to schedule your bulky item pick up. Large or bulky items include: scrap metal, wood, old appliances, furniture, televisions, computer monitors, refrigerator, tree branches, mattresses, etc.

Pool Discharge Tips

Maintain your pool properly and help protect the environment

DID YOU KNOW?

Routine swimming pool maintenance generates a variety of wastes such as cleaning wastewater, filter back-wash residues, biocides and acid washes that can contribute to stormwater pollution. Chlorine and other pool chemicals can harm our waterways when they are discharged improperly.



Share these good housekeeping practices with your pool service personnel to keep pollutants out of our waterways:

HOLD IT BEFORE YOU DRAIN IT.

- De-chlorinate the water before draining the pool to the storm drain.
- Consult with your pool contractor before de-chlorinating the pool to learn about your options.

SHUT:

Shut off the chlorination system or stop adding chlorine.

HOLD:

Hold the water in the pool for at least 5 days or add a de-chlorinating agent.

TEST:

Use a pool testing kit to ensure the level of chlorine is at 0.1ppm before discharging the water.

- Make sure all debris is removed and chemicals are dissipated.
- pH of pool water should be between 6.5 and 8.5 before discharging.
- Make sure the water is free of any discoloration, mosquitoes, dirt or algae.

IMPORTANT:

- Dispose of filter backwash solids in the trash or landscape area.
- Neutralize acid washes before discharging to the sewer. Do not discharge to the storm drain.

DRAIN:

Check with your city for local requirements before discharging your pool to the storm drain or sewer.

- **Alternative 1: Sanitary Sewer** — Some cities allow pools to be drained to the sanitary sewer during non-peak hours.
- **Alternative 2: Lawn or Garden** — Discharge the pool water through the lawn or garden. The flow should be controlled to prevent erosion problems or the water entering a neighbor's property.
- **For Saltwater Pools:** Saltwater pools should only be drained to the sewer or hauled away.

Stay by the car until help arrives.



PROTECT YOUR PET

Keep pets safe by preventing them from getting lost.

TAKE THESE STEPS TO PREVENT A LOST PET

- Pet-proof your house and yard to avoid your pet being able to wander out of your home and getting lost
- Place a well-fitting collar on your pets with pet tags that contain your contact information
- Get your pets microchipped so that in case they ever get lost without a collar, or their collar falls off, they can still be identified and returned to you




