




## NATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS WEEK



### EXPANSION ON SAN CARLO TOWNHOME APARTMENTS

There is much happening at the 'Greenspot Village & Marketplace' these days. Highland residents have been enjoying the recent openings of Costco Warehouse and Corky's Homestyle Kitchen and Bakery and are anxiously awaiting the completion of Ono Hawaiian BBQ visible from Greenspot Road. In addition to commercial development, this area contains prime residential living.

The San Carlo Townhome Apartments, located between Webster Street and Calhoun Road have been open nearly a year. The development features beautiful Spanish architecture, mature landscaping, pool, garage parking, and one-, two-, and three-bedroom options.



San Carlo was so popular, that a second phase has started construction to the north. Phase II will add 272 new units with their own clubhouse, pool, parks and walking trail. The architecture will have a similar Spanish style (featured below) with floorplan options between 800 and 1,200 square feet, incorporating one- and two-car garages.

## RESIDENTIAL FOOD WASTE RECYCLING PROGRAM

With food waste recycling now a California law, let's briefly take a look at the process. 🍴

- Food waste is separated from other household waste and recycling.
- Bagged food waste is added directly to the green organics barrel.
- Once picked up, food waste and green waste are hauled to a processing facility.
- The plastic bags are removed, and all the organics are cleaned, sorted, and organized for various methods of composting.
- After the curing process, the organic waste has now transformed into a finished compost, a nutrient-rich soil amendment for multiple applications.



Thank you for doing your part by recycling your food waste!

### FAQs - Residential Food Waste Recycling Program

- Am I required to participate? Yes. SB1383 is a California law that requires all residents, multifamily tenants, and commercial businesses to participate in food waste recycling.
- Will plastic bags be supplied? Customers will be required to use their own bags. Bags do not need to be compostable or biodegradable.
- What is the benefit of recycling food waste? Your recycling efforts contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from landfilled organic waste. This includes methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more potent than carbon dioxide.
- I already backyard compost, do I have to participate? We encourage you to continue backyard composting. Organic items not suitable for backyard compost can be recycled through this program.
- Can I use my garbage disposal instead? No need to change your current garbage disposal use. Food currently being discarded in your trash barrel should now be bagged and placed in your green waste barrel.
- What items are acceptable? Fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, dairy, eggshells, bread, food scraps, food soiled paper, plate scrapings, and expired food.
- What items are not acceptable? Trash, styrofoam, liquids, glass, plastic, metal, diapers, pet waste, electronic waste, and hazardous waste

## WHAT TO DO DURING AN EARTHQUAKE

When Shaking Starts, **DROP, COVER, and HOLD ON** to Protect Yourself

- If you are in bed, **STAY** there and **COVER** your head and neck with a pillow. Lie face down.
- If you are outdoors, drop, then crawl towards open space if you can. Stay away from buildings, power lines, and trees.
- If you are driving, stop and stay in your vehicle. Avoid stopping near buildings, trees, overpasses, and utility wires. Proceed cautiously once the earthquake has stopped. Avoid bridges or ramps.



- If you are in a wheelchair or use a walker, lock your wheels, and remain seated until the shaking stops. Protect your head and neck with your arms, a pillow, a book, or whatever is available. If you are unable to drop, brace yourself and protect your head and neck.

## EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST

An earthquake is the sudden shaking of the earth caused by underground rock movement. Injuries often occur from falling debris or attempts to run. Aftershocks typically follow the initial quake. Earthquakes can trigger tsunamis, fires, landslides, and utility damage, and they are unpredictable—but preparation can reduce harm.


### WHAT TO DO BEFORE AN EARTHQUAKE

Understand your risk	Check if you live in an earthquake-prone area.
Practice DROP, COVER, and HOLD ON	DROP to your hands and knees. COVER your head and neck and seek shelter under stable furniture or near an interior wall. HOLD ON until the shaking stops.
Plan to Stay Connected	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Have backup power for phones.</li> <li>2. Use a battery-powered radio.</li> <li>3. Form a support team.</li> <li>4. Learn about early-warning systems if available.</li> </ol>
Secure Your Space	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Anchor heavy items like furniture, TVs, and water heaters.</li> <li>2. Consider earthquake insurance and structural evaluations.</li> </ol>
Learn Emergency Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know First Aid, CPR, and how to turn off home utilities.</li> <li>• Keep a fire extinguisher and know how to use it</li> </ul>
Gather Emergency Supplies	<p>Gather food, water, and medicine. Stores and pharmacies might be closed so organize supplies into a Go-Kit, Stay-at-Home Kit, and a Bed-Kit.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go-Kit: 3 days of portable essentials.</li> <li>• Stay-at-Home Kit: 2 weeks of food, water, and medicine.</li> <li>• Bed-Kit: Supplies near your bed (shoes, flashlight, whistle, etc.).</li> <li>• Keep a 1-month supply of medications and secure important documents</li> </ul>

### WHAT TO DO AFTER AN EARTHQUAKE

Stay Safe	<p>Wait briefly before moving, check for hazards, and wear sturdy shoes. If safe, go outside to a clear area away from falling dangers. If you're near the coast, move to higher ground immediately in case of a tsunami. Be prepared for aftershocks—Drop, Cover, and Hold On if they occur. If trapped, cover your mouth/nose and signal for help with sound. Treat injuries and help others. If your home is unsafe, go to a safer place and take emergency supplies. Avoid fire risks—use flashlights, not candles or lighters.</p>
Stay Connected	<p>Follow local news for updates. Let loved ones know you're safe.</p>
Check Your Home	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Follow official instructions and check your home for structural or utility damage.</li> <li>2. Turn off utilities if needed and report gas leaks from a safe location.</li> </ol>
Take Care of Yourself	<p>Manage stress with proper rest and nutrition. Call or text the Disaster Distress Helpline (1-800-985-5990) if you need emotional support.</p>
