We're announcing our City Hall holiday schedule early this year to help our residents plan ahead for this upcoming change. Please note that our office will be closed from Christmas Eve, Wednesday, December 24, 2025 through New Year's Day, Thursday, January 1, 2026. We will resume our regular business hours on Monday, January 5, 2026.

We encourage residents to plan ahead for any City-related business that may need attention before the break. Inspection services from Building & Safety, Code Enforcement, and Engineering will be made available during these dates except for the holidays observed (Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's).

Residents are still encouraged to submit their non-emergency concerns through our online portal, "Report an Issue". City staff will ensure that each submission is addressed promptly.

The City's closure does not affect the Highland Sheriff's Department or Fire Department services.

LET'S GET ROLLING: PAVEMENT PROJECT COMING SOON

Highland, we're on a roll - literally! A major street repaving project is kicking off next week, and we're giving our roads the smooth makeover they've been waiting for. Say goodbye to bumps and hello to a buttery-smooth surface! The upcoming street repaving project includes improvements along key corridors including 5th Street, Greenspot Road, Sterling Avenue, and Orange Street.

The project includes grinding and repaving roads with new asphalt, upgraded retroreflective striping and markings, and a number of safety-focused enhancements, with completion expected by August 2025. The City awarded the pavement rehabilitation contract to Matich Corporation and scheduled the work during the school break to minimize impacts on students and school-related traffic.



HELP KEEP HIGHLAND CLEAN: REPORT ILLEGAL DUMPING EASILY ONLINE

Illegal dumping isn't just an eyesore; it's a public health hazard and a threat to our environment. Whether it's old furniture, construction debris, or abandoned tires, improper disposal of waste can quickly degrade the quality of our neighborhoods and open spaces.

Fortunately, the City of Highland makes it easy for residents to take action. If you spot illegal dumping in your area, you can report it in just a few minutes using the city's "Report an Issue" online portal.

How to Report Illegal Dumping 📱

1. Visit the City's Website:
 - Go to www.cityofhighland.org.
2. Click "Report an Issue":
 - You'll find the "Report a Concern" button on the middle of the homepage.
3. Select a Category:
 - Choose "Illegal Dumping" from the list of available issues.
4. Provide Details:
 - Include specific information such as:
 - Location of the dumping (an address or nearby intersection)
 - Type of items dumped (mattresses, construction debris, etc.)
 - Any identifying information if the dumping was witnessed (e.g., license plate if witnessed)
5. Upload a Photo (Optional but Helpful):
 - If you can safely take a photo, upload it with your report to help city staff assess the situation more quickly.
6. Submit Your Report:
 - Your concern will be routed to the appropriate department for follow-up. You may also choose to receive updates on your request status.



Mobile-Friendly and Anonymous 📱

The portal works on desktop and mobile devices. You can also submit reports anonymously if you prefer, though providing contact information can help if staff need clarification.

Why It Matters 🤝

- By reporting illegal dumping, you help:
 - Keep public spaces clean and safe
 - Protect wildlife and waterways from hazardous materials
 - Reduce cleanup costs funded by taxpayer dollars
 - Deter repeat offenders through increased monitoring

PIPELINE SAFETY - IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION ABOUT NATURAL GAS PIPELINES NEAR YOU

Public officials are encouraged to work with contractors to have buried utility-owned lines marked before excavation. Everyone, including contractors, homeowners, and residents, should **contact 811**. This is a free service and it could help prevent injury or death, costly property damage and loss of utility service.



MARK OUT your proposed project area in white paint or provide other suitable markings.



CONTACT 811 Underground Service Alert (USA) for a ticket at least two business days before digging, not including the date of notification. Request a ticket at california811.org or dial **811**. SoCalGas will be contacted, as well as other local utility owners, to mark the location of all utility-owned lines for FREE. Check utility responses to your 811 ticket by visiting DigAlert.org or USANorth.org.



USE ONLY HAND TOOLS within 24 inches, plus half the size of the subsurface on each side of marked utility lines, to carefully expose the exact locations of all lines.



WAIT TO DIG until SoCalGas either mark our natural gas pipelines or you are advised that the area is clear.

PLEASE NOTE: SoCalGas is responsible for marking natural gas pipelines up to the natural gas meter. To locate and mark customer-owned lines, which typically run from the meter to natural gas equipment, contact a qualified pipe-locating professional.



RECOGNIZING A NATURAL GAS LEAK

Be alert to any of the signs you may see, hear, or smell when there is a leak.

- **LOOK** - If you see a damaged connection to a natural gas appliance, dirt/water blowing into the air, a dry patch of grass, fire or an explosion near a pipeline.
- **LISTEN** - If you hear unusual sounds like hissing or whistling.
- **SMELL** - If you smell the distinctive odor of natural gas.

IF YOU SMELL NATURAL GAS, SUSPECT A LEAK, OR DAMAGE HAS OCCURRED

- Immediately evacuate the area. Call SoCalGas at 1-800-427-2200 from a safe location.
- If there is damage resulting in a natural gas leak that may endanger life, cause bodily harm or property damage, call 911 promptly from a safe location.

DO NOT smoke or light a match, candle or create any other flame. Static electricity can ignite leaking natural gas.

DO NOT use machinery, turn electric appliances or lights on or off, or use any device that could cause a spark.

DO NOT attempt to control the leak or repair a damaged pipe or meter.


YOUR SAFETY IS IMPORTANT

SoCalGas pipelines deliver natural gas to approximately 22 million residential and business customers. To protect the integrity of its energy system, SoCalGas performs various pipeline safety and maintenance tasks, including testing, repairing, replacing, and upgrading its pipelines — and has ongoing technical training and testing for employees. To perform these tasks, we must be able to access the pipeline right-of-way. Please keep the area above pipelines accessible.


